In September 2021, The Alabama Medical Cannabis Commission voted to make Alabama Treasurer John McMillan the executive director of the commission.

McMillan was chosen after a lengthy search by a subcommittee of the commission. The

subcommittee narrowed it down to three candidates who were interviewed. The subcommittee recommended McMillan to the committee. His hiring was passed unanimously.

McMillan was elected Alabama state treasurer in 2018. McMillan served two terms as Alabama Commissioner of Agriculture and Industries from 2011 to 2019. Prior to that, McMillan served as executive director of the Alabama Forestry Association for 20 years and as commissioner of the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources. He served two terms in the Alabama Legislature and served on the Baldwin County Commission.

Jan. 24th Meeting...



Our Rotary guest speaker on January 24 was Dr. Jack Hawkins, the chancellor of Troy University. He has held that position since 1989 and has led the university through tremendous growth and change. (Pictured L to R: Dr Jack Hawkins, President Stacia Robinson and

More than \$350 million has been invested in capital improvements, including new academic buildings on all four of Troy's Alabama campuses, which are in Troy, Montgomery, Dothan and Phenix City. Hawkins led the university's evolution to become an international institution.

Hawkins says these are challenging and disruptive times. He compared this to the early 1900s, when the boll weevil ravaged the cotton crop, forcing farmers to diversify. The advent of growing peanuts, soybeans and sweet potatoes turned out to be good for the agriculture industry.

He says nationally, some higher education institutions have been faced with mergers, closures or realignments. Seventeen colleges closed last year, including Judson College in Marion, which was founded in 1838 and had been the fifth-oldest women's college in the country.

Besides COVID, Hawkins says the challenges facing colleges and universities include declining enrollment, lower birth rates leading to a smaller pool of students, fears of student debt and a lack of confidence that a degree will guarantee a better life.

Hawkins says Troy is well positioned to meet those challenges. He says Troy remains competitive, with a wide range of options for students to pursue. He has told his deans that every student needs an internship in order to be prepared to enter the workforce. Finally, he says Troy maintains good stewardship of its resources, which has limited the need to raise tuition.
