Dec. 20th Meeting...



Our Rotary guest speaker on December 20 was Catherine Coleman Flowers, a local environmental activist. She joined us via zoom. Flowers was featured on the CBS News

program "60 Minutes" this month for her work to solve wastewater issues in Lowndes County and elsewhere.

While Flowers is known internationally, she says she is a country girl who loves land and people. Unfortunately, she says sanitation inequities plague families in many rural areas who don't have the money or influence to fix the problem.

She gave several examples of raw sewage backing up in homes, a condition that can spread disease. Her goal is to get people away from using septic tanks.

Flowers says Alabama could lead the way in solving a problem that others treat with complacency. She says the top research experts in Huntsville are an untapped resource. Ideally, she'd like sewage to be treated in homes, turning it into drinking water to eliminate the need for sewer pipes or systems.

At the very least, Flowers says homeowners should not be responsible for septic tank problems over \$1,000. She wants manufacturers to offer 10-year parts and service warranties, just like the makers of other household products.

Flowers says the \$1 trillion infrastructure bill that Congress passed last month contains about \$175 million to help rural communities. She says that amount won't solve wastewater problems in Lowndes County, much less in the rest of the state or in other states. She is hopeful that in Montgomery, the city council will work to get people off of septic tanks.
